

The meeting was chaired by the Metropolitan Commissioner, HMDA as the Chairman of the Committee and the list of members / officers attended the meeting is annexed herewith.

1. The Chairman of the Lake Protection Committee welcomed the members on the action taken on the decisions taken in the earlier LPC Meetings.
2. A detailed discussion was held regarding Protection & restoration of Lakes, issues connected with and measures to be taken in the matter.
3. The GHMC, Commissioner informed that they have completed the survey of 54 Lakes and shall take steps to fix the FTL pillars. Further it was informed that GHMC have invited tender for appointment of consultants to prepare a detail project report of 176 Lakes within the jurisdiction of the GHMC.
(Action: Commissioner, GHMC)
4. The Collector, R.R. District also informed that they have prioritized 15 Lakes and obtained relevant physical data for providing fence around the Lake from protection. Collector to coordinate the demarcation, FTL pillars fixing & fencing of Lake, with a team of Asst. Engineer, Revenue & other officials.
(Action: Collector, R.R. District, Commissioner, GHMC)
5. The Chairman, LPC suggested that for protection of Lakes it is necessary that we must fix the FTL boundaries through GPS and total station survey with lat-long and to superimpose the FTL locations on the Revenue maps with survey numbers. It was further informed by the Chairman, LPC that the fixing of the FTL boundary and construction of the RCC pillars shall be a simultaneous activity. The Chairman, further said Irrigation Department shall fix a agency duly inviting competitive bids and shall take up works in coordination with the GHMC and revenue officials.
(Action: Commissioner, GHMC & C.E., Minor Irrigation)
6. The Chairman, LPC also suggested that fencing may be taken up for protecting the Lakes and if required may provide access if there are shikam pattas.
(Action: Collector, R.R. District, & C.E., Minor Irrigation)
7. The Chairman also reviewed the Lok Ayukta and High Court cases. He suggested that prompt action may be taken and a status report may be forwarded for information on such cases to the Committee.
(Action: All members of LPC)

8. APPCB to take water quality sampling analysis once in a year in the Metropolitan Area, may be in September – October of the year.

(Action: APPCB)

9. The Chairman, LPC suggested that it is important to identify landfill sites for debris filling as most of the construction material is being dumped in some of the Lakes. A suggestion was made to identify abandoned quarry sites which may be used for this purpose. Police officials from Hyderabad & Cyberabad informed that action will be taken against concerned found to be indulging in the illicit activities concerning the Lakes.

(Action : Commissioner of Police, Hyderabad & Cyberabad)

10. The Commissioner, GHMC made a suggestion that it may be a good idea to establish a call center to meet the demand supply requirement for debris disposal.

(Action: All members of LPC)

11. The Chairman, LPC informed the members that there are number of enquiries regarding adoption and beautification of Lakes. It was agreed that the request can be considered duly preparing the guidelines for protection of Lakes with the consideration for maintenance of the inflow and outflow channels.

(Action: All members of LPC)

12. The Chairman, LPC suggested that HMDA shall take action on balance Lakes (501-176=325) in erstwhile HUDA area duly taking into consideration the Lakes in GHMC Area. Further it is suggested to enumerate the Lakes in the HMDA area beyond the erstwhile HUDA limits.

(Action: HMDA)
